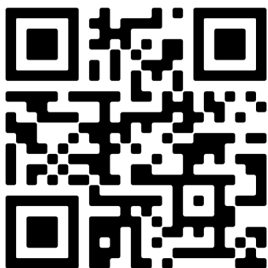
## HEALTH CHECK

The Bank of Hawaii Health Check App can help you protect your employees and customers by:

- **Streamlining** your COVID-19 screening processes
- **Minimizing** the risk of exposure to you, your employees, and the community
- **Helping** your employees understand their role in keeping our community safe

The Health Check App is a quick, 3 question survey to determine if it's safe for your employee to come to work.

While the app does not detect COVID-19, it serves as an added layer of protection by identifying individuals who may be exhibiting symptoms, or who may have been exposed or potentially exposed to COVID-19 to perform a self-assessment before they come to work. Check out the app for yourself!

### TIPS FOR USING THE HEALTH CHECK APP WITH YOUR BUSINESS

- 1. Pair the Health Check App with a Temperature Check each time an employee enters the premises**  
Make sure you know who will be responsible, each day, for checking the results and taking temperatures. This will make it easier for your employees to understand the process.
- 2. Ask your employees to complete the questionnaire before they arrive**  
This will make the screening process faster and easier.
- 3. Define a plan for when an employee's questionnaire results or temperature deem it unsafe for them to work**  
Having a clear plan to continue operations while allowing employees to go home when appropriate will help improve employee morale and protect our community.

Because your privacy is very important to us, we will not ask for any personally identifiable information in this app. Nor does the app use location tracking or collect any information. No information will be used or shared for commercial purposes.

The app is intended for residents of the State of Hawaii, Guam, Saipan and Palau to determine if they have symptoms before going to work. It is not intended to give medical advice.
